


University Common Core Requirement (4Y)

It is not uncommon for most of the courses enrolled in the first term of study will be used to fulfill the University Common Core Requirements.



Area A: English Communication

The 6 credits (or units) of English Communication will usually be fulfilled by LANG 1002A/S (in Fall term) and LANG 1003 (in Spring term).





For students with transfer credits granted, the English Communication Course requirements will be fulfilled as below.






Area B: Chinese Communication

It is required to select 3 credits (or units) (usually a course) of Chinese Communication from the Common Core course list to fulfill this requirement.



Area C: Quantitative Reasoning (QR)


The 3 credits (or units) of Quantitative Reasoning requirement is normally fulfilled by MATH1013 taken in Year 1.





Area D: Science and Technology (S&T)


The system will automatically try to match the enrolled courses to the requirements. In this case, LIFS 1030 is in the S&T SSC course list, hence the 3 credits (or units) S&T SSC requirement is satisfied. This student is required to select another 3 credits (or units) from the S&T course list (refer to http://uce.ust.hk).





Area E: Social Analysis (SA)

In this example, ECON2103 is in the SA course list but not in the SA SSC course list. Therefore, the SA SSC requirement has not been satisfied yet; it is required to select another 3 credits (or units) in the SA SSC common core course list (refer to http://uce.ust.hk).





Area F: Humanities (H)

In this example, the student has not taken any courses in Common Core Humanities, hence the student needs to take 3 credits (or units) from Humanities SSC course list and 3 credits (or units) from Humanities course list.

Area F: Humanities (H)

Students are required to complete the following number of units of common core courses. Among them at least 3 units from School-Sponsored Courses (SSC).

Area G: Core Elective (Arts / H / QR / SA / S&T)

Enrolled common core courses (other than Arts) will be used to fulfill specific requirements in other areas first. After those requirements are satisfied, excess credits (or units) enrolled (taken), if any, will be used to fulfill the Core Elective requirement.

Area G: Core Elective (Arts / H / QR / SA / S&T)

Satisfied: Only when you have fulfilled,

- a) Totally 6 units from following common core courses or
- b) Surplus common core course credits earned in other areas which are allowed to overflow to this area.
- Course used to fulfill Core Elective Requirement



Area H: Healthy Lifestyle

HLTH1010 is a required course in the first year of study. Students are required to fulfill the detailed course requirements in BOTH Fall and Spring terms. For further details, please refer to Student Affairs Office (SAO).

Students are expected to complete 12 credits in English language, six credits through required English courses in the University Common Core, and another six through courses approved for the English language requirement.




All SBM students should take SBMT 2020 (2 credits / units). On the report below, the word "Fall" under "When" column indicates that the course will be typically offered in Fall term.






Students who wish to pursue BBA GBUS must take LABU 2050 (3 credits / units) and 1 credit (or unit) of other courses with English communication component (details to be provided in due course by Center for Language Education).



Other SBM students not pursuing BBA GBUS must take LABU 2051 (2 credits / units) and LABU 2052 (2 credits / units).

In addition to the requirements of their major programs, students are required to complete the School Requirements as shown below.


Some courses can be used to fulfill both School Requirements and University Common Core Requirements. Students may reuse a maximum of 6 credits of these courses to count towards both Requirements.

Business Breadth

The Business Breadth requirement will be further elaborated AFTER a major program has been declared.

This section will be displayed at the bottom of the first major requirement upon declaration of the first major for a student.

Business Breadth

Not Satisfied: Requirement

All BBA students, except those of BBA GBM who are not allowed to pursue additional major, need to take 3 business courses (9 credits) from other disciplines which are not included in the University Common Core. Students can make use of all of these business breadth courses to fulfill their second major requirement.

Students who enroll in BBA GBM or the BSc majors of SBM are not required to fulfill this requirement.

This requirement will be displayed at the bottom of your first major requirement upon declaration of the first major.

Major in Global Business (BBA) (4Y)

After a major is declared (usually in the second year for GBUS and third year for other majors), the corresponding requirements associated with the major program will be shown. Here is an example for a student in BBA (Global Business) program.






GBUS students are required to complete either Capstone Project (I and II) or Capstone Thesis.





Major elective and other requirements





Business Breadth

The Business Breadth requirement for a GBUS student will typically fulfilled by the courses taken for the second business major program.
